Strength of the School

The strength of our school continues to grow steadily over the years. At present, we have a total of 1,393 students enrolled from Class I to XII. Each student is given opportunities to develop their potential in academics, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities under the guidance of our committed faculty.

Academic Achievements

Academic excellence continues to be the pride of our institution. This year, our students once again brought glory through their outstanding performance in the board examinations.

In the Class X Board Examination, out of 92 students, 78 secured Distinction and 14 obtained First Class, with 9 students achieving Full A1.

Special Initiatives and Programmes

This academic year has witnessed several noteworthy developments aimed at enhancing the learning environment and overall school infrastructure.

To promote technology-integrated learning, interactive boards have been installed in all classrooms, enabling teachers to make lessons more engaging and effective. In addition, cameras with audio facilities have been fitted in every classroom and corridor to ensure safety, transparency, and better supervision.

A major infrastructural enhancement this year is the roofing of the basketball court situated in front of the school, along with the addition of a synthetic floor, providing an all-weather sports facility for students.

Further, LED walls have been installed in the Auditorium and KG Quadrangle, enhancing the quality of visual presentations and cultural events.

Class magazines for Grades I–XII were released on November 14th, in connection with Children's Day.

Entrance coaching classes by XYLEM group is conducting in the evening and holidays for class XI students.

We have added a new school bus to enhance and strengthen our conveyance facilities for students.

To promote English reading habits, an English daily has been introduced in every class, encouraging students to read regularly and improve their language skills.
